The Park District receives 4.56% of your total real estate taxes paid.


Program Revenue \$3.5 Million


The Park District continued to provide exceptional services—

- Canine Campus welcomed 389 owners and their pups
- Bettenhausen Rec saw _____users through its doors
- 8,454 rounds of miniature golf were played by groups and individuals

Miscellaneous Revenue \$286,659

Additional revenues were generated by the Park District through rentals, vending, cell towers, donations and ticket sales.





EXPENDITURES

Recreation Fund \$2.5 Million

The Park District provides more than 1,300 programs, 50 special events, and multiple performing and fine arts performances and events each year. The most recent independent survey shows 94% of residents were satisfied to very satisfied with the programs offered by the District.

Debt Service Fund \$2.1 Million

The Park District continues to pay back debt service on bonds sold to make capital improvements throughout the district. The current debt service is scheduled to be completely retired by 2020.

General Fund \$1.4 Million

The general fund is used to pay expenses for maintenance of all park properties which includes eight facilities, 43 parks, 452 acres of land, and numerous baseball, soccer and football fields, volleyball, basketball and tennis courts, natural areas and pavilions.

Capital Development Fund \$546,924

These expenditures include Improvements to various parks including installation of new play structures at three parks and the start of a complete upgrade at Veterans Park.

Water Park Fund \$887,301

The 5 acre water park continues to be a popular summer destination for residents, members and daily visitors. The 3 slides, lazy river and new play structure are just a few of the amenities that drew over 73,000 in 2018!

Fitness Fund \$802,772

Tinley Fitness continues to expand its services to members and the community through health and wellness programs in addition to its state of the art facility, classes, instructors and personal trainers.

Special Rec Fund \$485,085

This fund supports programming provided through South Suburban Special Recreation Association, which is an extension of the Park District. Funds are also used for addressing ADA requirements and improving accessibility for all Park District patrons.

Other Funds \$1.4 million

Expenses included here are security, Illinois Municipal Retirement, Social Security, museums, historical building, Tinley Junction, and liability insurance.
